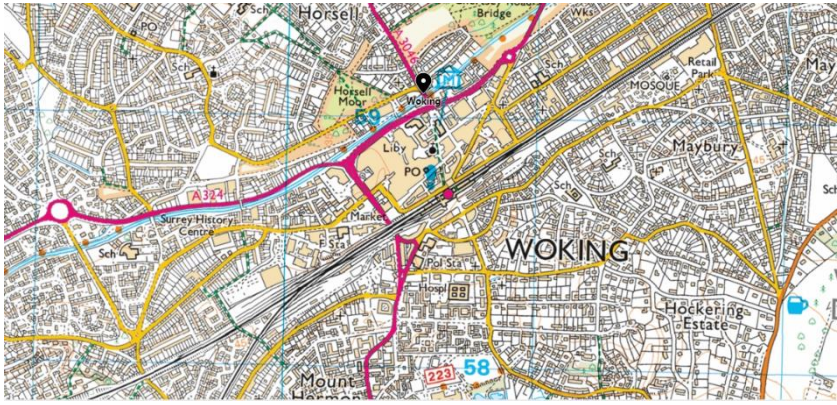
WOKING

Opening Questions

<p><i>What do you already know about Woking?</i> Create a bullet point list on what you already know about Woking. Draw a sketch map of the area picking out key aspects. Remember to annotate certain features and consider why you've represented it in that kind of way. <p><i>Where is it on the rural/urban spectrum?</i> What has informed your view on the position of Woking on the rural/urban spectrum? What sources do you use to make a judgement on this?</p>	
<p><i>What is the boundary of your chosen place?</i> Ward? Parish boundary?</p>	
<p><i>Is there an obvious place identity?</i> How do local descriptions, your own thoughts, school/colleges and businesses help shape the identity of Woking?</p>	
<p><i>What economic activity and inequalities are there?</i> Using sources such as the census, neighbourhood statistics, NOMIS and Office of National Statistics, is there any economic activity/inequality?</p>	
<p><i>What are its functions? Is there any evidence to suggest that these functions have changed over time?</i> Industrial? Retail? Administrative? Commercial?</p>	

Enquiry Question 1: How and why do places vary?

Regional Influences

<p>How well is Woking connected in terms of transport? Using OS Maps and public transport timetables can you make a judgement on how well Woking is connected in terms of its public transport?</p>	
<p>Are there any major cities nearby and what is the impact on these places?</p>	
<p>What are the policies on growth and development? Use local authority websites to find out if the area has plans for growth.</p>	

National Influences

<p>What are the political inclinations of the national government? How might local election results impact on the area? How might general election results and referendum results impact on the area?</p>	
<p>How strong is the sense of community? Using social media and your own personal experience, can you judge the level of social community?</p>	
<p>What are the pressures for change? Local newspapers and council websites may suggest the pressures for change.</p>	

Global Influences

<p><i>Are there any brands present – retail outlets, branch, factories and offices?</i> Land use surveys General observations</p>	
<p><i>Is there any involvement in global tourism?</i> Tourist information</p>	
<p><i>How well connected to the internet is Woking?</i> Can you test out accessing fibre optic in Woking? Is there any secondary data which tells you about Broadband speeds in Woking?</p>	

International Influences

<p><i>Are your places directly affected by specific government/EU policies or designations?</i></p>	
<p><i>Is your place ‘twinned’ with a location abroad? Why was that place chosen?</i></p>	
<p><i>How do your places compare with the national average of wealth and deprivation?</i> Index of Multiple Deprivation</p>	
<p><i>How accessible is Woking to locations around the world?</i> Airports, Ports, International train travel (Eurostar)?</p>	

IDENTITY

It is important that you consider how these influences affect the identity of that area. On a separate piece of paper take each of the factors below and explain how they have shaped the identity of Woking.

1. A change in function
2. Economic characteristics (e.g. sector, type of employment, unemployment)
3. Population characteristics (e.g. age, migration, ethnic composition, gentrification)
4. Socio-economic inequalities in pay, levels of education and health.
